#### Adapt to Meet the Needs of Today's Students

☑ Increase flexible learning modalities and structures.



### Conduct Strategic Outreach

- ⊗ Reach out to students who stop out.
- Use inclusive marketing materials and language.
- Reframe academic probation and provide support.



#### Remove Reenrollment Barriers

- Reinstate students' priority registration status upon their return.
- ⊗ Review catalog rights policies.
- ⊙ Offer credit for prior learning.

- Waive application and reenrollment requirements and fees.
- Offer payment plans and other forms of financial assistance.
- Develop a comebacker-specific orientation.
